# <u>Angelína</u>



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### <u>Materíals:</u>

- Catona: 50 gr white
  - 25 gr skin color
  - 25 gr brown or taupe (black is also possible, but is going to be very hard to do)
  - 2 meter geel
- Hook 2 mm
- 25 cm thin iron wire
- 1 pipecleaner
- Stuffing
- 75 cm lace of 5 cm width
- 2 safety eyes 6 mm
- 1 skewer (optional)
- Cap from a soda bottle.
- The number of grams is generous, you even need less ©

## Stitches & Abbreviations:

- MR Magic ring
- Ch chain chain stitch
- Slst slip stitch
- Sc single crochet
- Hdc half double crochet
- Dc double crochet
- Tc treble crochet
- Dtc double treble crochet
- Sc2 in 1 Inc 2 single crochet in 1 stitch increase
- Hdc2 in 1 inc 2 half double crochet in 1 stitch increase
- Dc2 in 1 inc 2 double crochet in 1 stitch increase

#### Tc2 in 1 - 2 treble crochet in 1 stitch – increase

Sc3 in 1 - inc - 3 single crochet in 1 stitch - increase

Dtc2 in 1 - 2 double treble crochet in 1 stitch - increase

Sc2tog – single crochet 2 stitches together - decrease

Rnd – round(s)

(..) at the end of the line indicates how many stitches you have after that row or row.

#### <u>Arm 2x:</u>

Using skin color.		
Rnd 01: MR with 6sc		(6)
Rnd 02: *Sc2 in 1, sc* x 3		(9)
Rnd 03: Sc in each stitch	CX C	(9)
Rnd 04: 1 PC with 4 hdc, 8 sc		(9)
Rnd 05: Sc in each stitch		(9)
Rnd 06: 4 sc, sc2tog, 3 sc		(8)
<b>Rnd 07:</b> *3 sc, Sc2 in 1* x 2		(10)

**Rnd 08:** 5 sc, 1 sc *with color change to white,* mark last stitch as end of the round. This does not change the amount of stitches.

Rnd 09: Sc in each stitch	(10)
Rnd 10: back loops only, Sc in each stitch	(10)
Rnd 11 – 13: Sc in each stitch	(10)
1 slst and <i>fasten off.</i>	



With the hand away from you, attach to the first remaining loop of round 10

Ch 2, 1 hdc in the same loop, 1 hdc, \*hdc2 in 1, 1 hdc\* rep \*\* to end of round, close with 1 slst in the 2<sup>e</sup> chain. *Fasten off.* 

• Take a pipe cleaner and do it double up to the length of the arm. Wrap tape around to about the thickness of the arm. Push the pipe cleaner into the arm. You no longer have to stuff.

#### <u> Foot 2x:</u>

#### Using white

Rnd 01: Ch 6, start in the second chain from the hook, 4 sc, Sc3 in 1, continue on the other side of the chain, 3 sc, Sc2 in 1 (12)

Rnd 02: Sc2 in 1, 3 sc, 3x *Sc2 in 1*, 3 sc, 2x *Sc2 in 1*	(18)
Rnd 03: sc, Sc2 in 1, 3 sc, Sc2 in 1, sc, 2x *Sc2 in 1*, sc, Sc2 in 1, 3 sc, Sc2 in 1, sc, 2x *Sc2 in 1*	(26)
Rnd 04: sc in each <i>back loop</i>	(26)
Rnd 05 – 06: Sc in each stitch	(26)
Rnd 07: 9 sc, 4x *sc2tog*, 9 sc	(22)
Rnd 08: 7 sc, 4x *sc2tog*, 7 sc	(18)
<b>Rnd 09:</b> 5 sc, 4x *sc2tog*, 5 sc	(14)
Mark the back loop from your last single crochet.	

Rnd 10: front loops only, \*slst, Ch 3 \* repeat to end of round, close with 1 slst in the 1st slip stitch

#### Fasten off.

- Crochet a sole from round 1 to round 3.
- Cut the size of the sole out of cardboard
- Hold the sole with the right side facing you. Insert your crochet hook in the next stitch AND in the 1<sup>st</sup> remaining loop on the foot, slst, insert your crochet hook in the next stitch AND in the next remaining loop, slst. Repeat all the way around this way. Closes with 1 slst in the 1<sup>st</sup> slip stitch. Don't forget to put your cardboard in between <sup>(C)</sup> Fasten off. (26)

#### Stuff foot firmly.



## Legs:

Using skin color.	
Rnd 01: attach with 1sc in the marked back loop on the foot, sc in each loop	(14)
Rnd 02 – 11: Sc in each stitch	(14)
Stuff firmly.	
<b>Rnd 12:</b> 2 sc, 1 Sc <i>with color change to white,</i> (you should now be at the center of this is not the case, adjust the stitches), mark your last single crochet in skin color round (this does not change the amount of stitches)	-
Rnd 13 - 14: Sc in each stitch	(14)
Rnd 15: 11 sc, 1 slst. Fasten off. The last 2 stitches remain unworked. This is your	left leg
Crochet another leg until row 14. We continue on this leg with row 15 as follows	S
Rnd 15: Sc in each stitch	(14)
Remove the mark.	
<b>Rnd 16:</b> 4 sc, Ch 3, take the left leg, 1 sc in the slipstitch (the legs are now connet 1 sc on each chainstitch between the legs, 14 sc on the right leg, 1 sc on each cha legs (this is on the other side of the chain), <i>mark the last stitch as end of the rou</i>	institch between the

Rnd 17 - 18: Sc in each stitch	(34)
Stuff the legs firmly.	
Rnd 19: 6 sc, sc2tog, 7 sc, sc2tog, 6 sc, sc2tog, 7 sc, sc2tog	(30)
Rnd 20: Sc in each stitch	(30)
<b>Rnd 21:</b> *3 sc, sc2tog* x 6	(24)
Rnd 22: Sc in each stitch	(24)
Rnd 23: back loops only, Sc in each stitch	(24)

#### Rnd 24 - 26: Sc in each stitch

You can now sew on the lace (see finishing)

Rnd 27: \*4 sc, sc2tog\* x 4

Rnd 28 – 29: Sc in each stitch

**Rnd 30:** 5 sc, take an arm, the first single crochet after the slipstitch is the first stitch you have to take to crochet this arm onto the body. Make sure the thumb points forwards, if not, take the other arm \*put your crochet hook through the stitch on the arm AND the next stitch on the body, crochet 1 sc\*, repeat \*\* 3 more times, 6 sc, take the second arm and count 5 stitches forwards after the slipstitch, this will be the first stitch to use, \*put your crochet hook through the stitch on the arm AND the next stitch on the arm AND the next stitch on the arm AND the next stitch (20)

**Rnd 31:** 5 sc, 6 sc on the remaining stitches of the arm, 6 sc, 6 sc on the remaining stitches of the second, 1 sc (24)

Rnd 32: 1 sc, 1 sc with color change to skin color, mark the last stitch as end of the round.

#### DON'T fasten off white. Put the white thread in the front. We'll continue with white after round 33.

Rnd 33: back loops only, 1 Sc in each stitch

<u>In between round with white:</u> with the neck towards you, pull up the white thread in the first remaining *loop*, \*Ch 3, 1 slst in the next loop\*, rep \*\* all around until the end. Close the round with a slst in the first stitch. *Fasten off white.* 

Stuff the body firmly.	
<b>Rnd 34:</b> *2 sc, sc2tog* x 6	(18)
<b>Rnd 35:</b> *1 sc, sc2tog* x 6	(12)
<b>Rnd 36:</b> *2 sc, sc2tog* x 3	(9)
Rnd 37: Sc in each stitch	(9)
Rnd 38: 2 sc in each stitch	(18)

Rnd 39: Sc in each stitch	(18)
<b>Rnd 40:</b> *2 sc, Sc2 in 1* x 6	(24)
<b>Rnd 41:</b> *3 sc, Sc2 in 1* x 6	(30)
<b>Rnd 42:</b> *4 sc, Sc2 in 1* x 6	(36)
<b>Rnd 43 – 44:</b> 1 Sc in each stitch	(36)

**Rnd 45:** 1 Sc in each stitch, mark a stitch somewhere on the front of this row. The eyes will be placed on this row later.**(36)** 

Rnd 46: 1 Sc in each stitch		(36)
<b>Rnd 47:</b> *4 sc, sc2tog* x 6	CO	(30)
<b>Rnd 48:</b> *3 sc, sc2tog* x 6		(24)
Rnd 49: *2sc, sc2tog* x 6		(18)

Stuff the neck. You can also put in a piece of skewer or something similar in the neck to the body. Also stuff the head firmly. We are now going to position the eyes. Place the eyes in the row with the marking and leave 4 stitches between the eyes. If you are satisfied with the position of the eyes, remove the stuffing from the head and put the safety caps the eyes. Stuff the head back firmly.

Rnd 50: *1 sc, sc2tog* x 6		(12)
<b>Rnd 51:</b> sc2tog x 6	$\sim$	(6)

Fasten off with a long thread. Weave the thread in the front loops and pull the gap close.

#### <u>Wíg:</u>

Using brown or color of your choice.

All rounds are hooked in the back loops. This will not be repeated in the description.

Rnd 01: MR with 6sc	(6)
Rnd 02: 2 sc in each stitch	(12)
<b>Rnd 03:</b> *1 sc, Sc2 in 1* x 6	(18)
<b>Rnd 04:</b> *2 sc, Sc2 in 1* x 6	(24)
<b>Rnd 05:</b> *3 sc, Sc2 in 1* x 6	(30)
<b>Rnd 06:</b> *4 sc, Sc2 in 1* x 6	(36)
Rnd 07: *1 slst, Ch 3* x 8, 1 slst, 27 sc, Ch 1, turn	(36)

From now on we will no longer only crochet in the back loops. So pay attention @ we also work in rows.

Row 08: front loops only, skip the 1 <sup>st</sup> stitch, 25 sc, Ch 1, turn	(25)
Row 09: <i>back loops only,</i> skip the 1 <sup>st</sup> stitch, 24 sc, Ch 1, turn	(24)
Row 10: front loops only, skip the 1 <sup>st</sup> stitch, 23 sc, Ch 1, turn	(23)
Row 11: back loops only, 23 sc, Ch 1, turn	(23)
Row 12: front loops only, skip the 1 <sup>st</sup> stitch, 20 sc, skip 1 stitch, 1 sc, Ch 6, turn	(21)
Row 13: front loops only, 1 slst, *Ch 6, 1 slst* rep ** to end of row	(21slst + 21chains)

We'll crochet from now on in all the remaining loops of the previous rounds and rows. So when it says "turn", you turn your work towards the row above the last edited row

**Row 14:** Ch 6, 1 slst in the row end, continue in the remaining loops of row 12, \*Ch 6, 1 slst\* rep \*\* to end of row, turn

**Row 15:** Ch 6, 1 slst in the row end, continue in the remaining loops of row 11, \*Ch 6, 1 slst\* rep \*\* to end of row, turn

Row 16 – 18: repeat row 14 and 15, one row higher than the previous one.

- If you have worked well you will be just above the chains of round 7.
- You can now work in 2 ways.
- Or crochet in rows from the corner where you are now to the other corner of the pony and back. So you go back and forth to the MR and then you have a small piece that you do in the same way.
- Or tie off now and start again in continuous rounds in the MR. This way, however, you get a very different effect in the hairstyle (looks more like a flower)

I used the first way.

When all loops are used, fasten off with a long thread. Sew the wig onto the head. If the wig is much too bigg, you have not stuffed the head enough. <sup>(i)</sup>



## <u>Wíng 1:</u>

Using white.	
<b>Row 01:</b> Ch 16, start in the $2^{nd}$ loop from the chain, 6 sc, 2 hdc, 4 dc, 3 Tc, Ch 1	(15)
Row 02: 1 crabstitch in <i>each front loop</i> , Ch 1	(15)
Row 03: work in the remaining loops behind the crabstitch, 5 sc, 2 hdc, 5 dc, 2 Tc, Tc3 in 1, Ch 2	1 <b>(17)</b>
Row 04: 1 crabstitch in <i>each front loop</i> , Ch 1	(17)
Row 05: work in the remaining loops behind the crabstitch, 4 sc, 2 hdc, 5 dc, 4 Tc, 1 Dtc, Dtc3 in	n 1, Ch 1 <b>(19)</b>
Row 06: 1 crabstitch in <i>each front loop</i> , Ch 1	(19)
Row 07: work in the remaining loops behind the crabstitch, 2 sc, 3 hdc, 2 dc, 4 Tc, 7 Dtc, Dtc3 i	in 1, Ch 1 <b>(21)</b>
Row 08: 1 crabstitch in <i>each front loop</i> , Ch 1	(21)

**Row 09:** *work in the remaining loops behind the crabstitch*, 20 sc, sc3 in the last loop, continue in the row ends. Make sure you work IN the stitches and not in the space, 3 sc in the "leg" of the Dtc, 1 sc in the row with the crabstitch, 3 sc in the "leg" of the Dtc, 1 sc in the row with the crabstitch, 2 sc in the "leg" of the Dtc, 1 sc in the row with the crabstitch, 2 sc in the "leg" of the dc, 1 sc in the row with the crabstitch, 2 sc in the "leg" of the dc, 1 sc in the first stitch of the startchain, 13 sc, 1 sc + 1 slst in the last stitch. **Fasten off.** 

## <u>Wíng 2:</u>

Using white.	
The chainstitches at the beginning of a row <b>DON'T</b> count as the first stitch.	
Row 01: Ch 18, start in the 4 <sup>th</sup> chain from the hook, 3 Tc, 4 dc, 2 hdc, 6 sc, Ch 1	(15)
Row 02: 1 crabstitch in <i>each front loop</i> , Ch 3	(15)
Row 03: work in the remaining loops behind the crabstitch, Tc3 in 1, 2 Tc, 5 dc, 2 hdc, 5 sc, Ch 1	(17)
Row 04: 1 crabstitch in <i>each front loop</i> , Ch 4	(17)
Row 05: work in the remaining loops behind the crabstitch, Dtc3 in 1, 1 Dtc, 4 Tc, 5 dc, 2 hdc, 4 s	sc, Ch 1 <b>(19)</b>
Row 06: 1 crabstitch in <i>each front loop</i> , Ch 4	(19)
Row 07: work in the remaining loops behind the crabstitch, Dtc3 in 1, 7 Dtc, 4 Tc, 2 dc, 3 hdc, 2 s	sc, Ch 1 <b>(21)</b>

## Row 08: 1 crabstitch in each front loop

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(21)

#### Fasten off.

Row 09: Attach with 1 sc in the first loop of the startchain (where your starting thread still hangs), 13 sc, sc3 in the last loop, continue in the row ends. Make sure you work IN the stitches and not in the space, 2 sc in the "leg" of the dc, 1 sc in the row with the crabstitch, 2 sc in the "leg" of the dc, 1 sc in the row with the crabstitch, 3 sc in the "leg" of the Dtc, 1 sc in the row with the crabstitch, 3 sc in the "leg" of the Dtc, 1 sc in the row with the crabstitch, sc3 in 1 in the first remaining loop behind the crabstitch, 20 sc behind the crabstitches. *Fasten off.* 



## <u>Halo:</u>

#### Using yellow.

Cut 25 cm thin iron wire. Twist the thread 2x around a cap of a bottle. Let the rest of the wire come together at the bottom and twist it together.



Now take a double wire yellow and go all the way around the iron wire. Also go a bit over the hanging part and glue it to approximately 1 cm. Allow to dry.



## <u> Fínísh:</u>

• 1. Frown the lace ribbon and sew it nicely distributed to the remaining loops of row 23. Begin at the middle of the back.

- 2. Sew the wings on the back, if you cover them with feathers, then do the side with the ridges on the back.
- 3. Embroider a nose between the eyes and a mouth 2 rnds lower. Put some blush on the cheeks and maybe some eyelashes on the eyes.
  4. Insert the halo in the back of the head.
