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My bunny is 29 cm tall from the top of ears to the bottom. Depending on the yarn you use and your hook strength, the size may be different from mine.

(..) at the end of the line indicates how many stitches you have after that tour or row.

## Arms 2x:

Using color no. 157.

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Rnd 01: MR with 6sc
Rnd 02: *2sc in 1* x 6
Rnd 03-05: 1sc in each stitch
Rnd 06: *sc2tog* x 4, 4sc
Rnd 07: *sc2tog* x 2, 4sc
Stuff moderate. The rest of the arm remains unstuffed. Afterwards, a pipe cleaner comes in.
Rnd 08-21: 1sc in each stitch (14 rounds)
1slst and fasten off.


## Legs 2x:

Cut off 2 threads of $\mathbf{3 0} \mathbf{c m}$ and 1 thread of 50 cm and put them aside $)$
Using color no. 157.
Rnd 01: Ch6, begin in the $2^{e}$ st from the hook, 2 sc in 1, $3 \mathrm{sc}, 4 \mathrm{Dc}$ in 1, continue on the other side of the chain, $3 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in 1

Rnd 02: $1 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in $1,2 \mathrm{sc}, 1 \mathrm{Hdc},{ }^{*} 2 \mathrm{Dc}$ in $1^{*} \mathrm{x} 4,1 \mathrm{Hdc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in $1,1 \mathrm{sc}$
Rnd 03: $2 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in $1,3 \mathrm{sc}, 1 \mathrm{Hdc},{ }^{*} 2 \mathrm{Dc}$ in $1^{*} \mathrm{x} 6,1 \mathrm{Hdc}, 3 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in $1,2 \mathrm{sc}$
Rnd 04: back loops only, 10sc, *2sc in $1^{*}$ x 8, 10sc
Rnd 05-06: 1sc in each stitch
Intermediate step: 2 sc , move your marker to this last single crochet as end of the round. This doesn't change the amount of stitches!

Rnd 07: 14sc, *sc2tog* x 4, 14sc
Rnd 08: 12sc, *sc2tog* x 4, 12sc
Rnd 09: 9sc, *sc2tog* x 5, 9sc
Rnd 10: 7sc, *sc2tog* x 2, 1sc, *sc2tog* x 2, 7sc

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Rnd 11: 7sc, sc2tog, 1sc, sc2tog, 7sc
Rnd 12: 7sc, sc3tog, 7sc
Stuff the foot firmly. Continue to stuff the leg while crocheting.
*** Using color no. 263 crochet a sole from rnd 01 to rnd 03. Crochet 1slst + Ch1. Place the sole on a piece of cardboard and draw the outline around. Now cut out your shape on the inside of the line. If necessary, cut to make the cardboard fit nicely. (photo 1)

With the leg opening facing you, take the first remaining loop of round 4 AND the slipstich on your sole (photo 2), crochet 1slst, repeat all the way around. Don't forget to put your cardboard between the soles before you're all the way around.


Fasten off. Hide all loose ends.
Continue on the leg.
Rnd 13 - 25: 1sc in each stitch
1slst and fasten off. (the slipstitch is the first stitch to use to connect the legs together)
Take 1 wire of 30 cm that you have already cut. Sew 5 threads to form the toes. You start just above the edge of the skin color. Go up from the outside and insert your needle back in the $4^{\text {th }}$ round. Pull your wire each time to form the toes. I have made the toes in the photos with a white thread so that you can clearly see where the toes come. Work your wires away invisibly when the toes are ready.


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Crochet a second leg in the same way up to and including round 25. Do NOT fasten off this leg. We crochet further on this right leg.

## Body:

Continue with brown. Out of convenience, we start back with rnd 1.
Rnd 01: 7sc, Ch4, 1sc on the slipstitch of the left leg, 14sc, 4sc on the chsts, 15sc on the leg, 4sc on the chsts. Mark the last stitch as end of round

Rnd 02: *2sc in $1^{*} \times 5,24 s c,{ }^{*} 2 s c$ in $1^{*} \times 9$
Rnd 03-06: 1sc in each stitch
Stuff.
Rnd 07: 10sc, sc2tog, 4sc, sc2tog, 9sc, sc2tog, 4sc, sc2tog, 17sc
Rnd 08-09: 1sc in each stitch
Rnd 10: 11sc, sc2tog, 16sc, sc2tog, 17sc
Stuff firmly and keep stuffing.
Rnd 11: 11sc, sc2tog, 15sc, sc2tog, 16sc
Rnd 12: *sc2tog* x 6, 16sc, *sc2tog* x 8
Rnd 13: 13sc, sc2tog, 13sc, sc2tog
Rnd 14: 1sc in each stitch
Rnd 15: *5sc, sc2tog* x 4
Rnd 16-17: 1sc in each stitch
Stuff firmly. Especially on the buttocks at the back. These should give a really nice curve.

- Take the 50 cm thread and put it in a needle.
- Insert in the middle between the legs (photo 1) and come out just above the last decrease of round 15 (photo 2 ).
- Go over the curve and go back in where you started between the legs and come back out on the same place above round 15.
- Pull the thread so that 2 buttocks are formed (photo 3).
- Tie the threads between the legs and hide the ends invisibly.
- You can now give the buttocks a thicker curve by adding extra stuffing.

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Rnd 18-21: 1sc in each stitch
Rnd 22: 7sc, insert your crochet hook through the slipstitch on the arm AND through the next stitch on the body, crochet 1 sc, *insert your crochet hook through the next stitch on the arm AND through the $^{\text {a }}$ next stitch on the body, crochet $1 \mathrm{sc} * \times 2,8 \mathrm{sc}$, insert your crochet hook from the inside through the slipstitch on the arm AND through the next stitch on the body, crochet 1sc, *insert your crochet hook through the next stitch on the arm AND through the next stitch on the body, crochet $1 s c^{*} \times 2,3 \mathrm{sc}(24)$

Put a small piece of tape around 1 end of the pipe cleaner and insert it all the way down into the arm. DO NOT cut off the end just yet.

Rnd 23: 7sc, 3sc on the remaining stitches of the arm, $8 \mathrm{sc}, 3 \mathrm{sc}$ on the remaining stitches of the arm, 3sc

Put some tape around the end of the pipe cleaners and push the pipe cleaners into the body. Stuff tightly around the pipe cleaners.


Rnd 24: *2sc, sc2tog* x 6
Rnd 25: *1sc, sc2tog* x 6
Rnd 26 - 28: 1sc in each stitch
Fasten off. Hide loose end.

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## Head:

Using color no. 157.
Rnd 01: MR with 6sc
Rnd 02: 2sc in each stitch
Rnd 03: front loops only, *1sc, 2sc in 1* x 6
Rnd 04: *1sc, 2sc in 1, 1sc* x 6
Rnd 05: *3sc, 2sc in 1* x 6
Rnd 06: *2sc, 2sc in 1, $2 \mathrm{sc}{ }^{*} \times 6$
Rnd 07: *5sc, 2 sc in $1^{*} \times 6$
Rnd 08: *3sc, 2sc in 1, 3sc* x 6
Rnd 09-14: 1sc in each stitch
Rnd 15: 21sc, Ch1, skip 1 stitch, 3sc, Ch1, skip 1 stitch, 22sc
Rnd 16: 10sc, *2sc in $1^{*} \times 12$ (the last 2 sc in 1 are in the chain space), $3 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in 1 in the chain space,
*2sc in $1^{*} \times 11,11 \mathrm{sc}$
Rnd 17-18: 1sc in each stitch
Rnd 19: 11sc, *sc2tog* $\times 2,15 \mathrm{sc}$, ${ }^{*}$ sc2tog* $\times 2,4 \mathrm{sc}$, *sc2tog* $^{2} 2,15 \mathrm{sc}$, ${ }^{*}$ sc2tog* $\times 2,11 \mathrm{sc}$
Rnd 20: 11sc, *sc2tog* x 2, 11sc, *sc2tog* x 2, 4sc, *sc2tog* x 2, 11sc, *sc2tog* x 2, 11sc
Rnd 21: 11sc, *sc2tog* $\times 2,7 \mathrm{sc},{ }^{*} \mathrm{sc} 2 \mathrm{tog}^{*} \times 2,4 \mathrm{sc},{ }^{*} \mathrm{sc} 2 \operatorname{tog}^{*} \times 2,7 \mathrm{sc},{ }^{*} \mathrm{sc} 2 \mathrm{tog}^{*} \times 2,11 \mathrm{sc}$
Rnd 22: 11sc, *sc2tog* x 6, 4sc, *sc2tog* x 6, 9sc
Place the eyes in the chain spaces of round 15.
Rnd 23: 2sc, sc2tog, *4sc, sc2tog* $\times 5$, 2sc
Rnd 24: *3sc, sc2tog* x 6

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Stuff the head tightly. Especially on the cheeks.
Rnd 25: 1sc, sc2tog, *2sc, sc2tog* $x$ 5, 1sc
Rnd 26: *1sc, sc2tog* x 6
Fasten off with a long thread to sew the head with.

## Facial expression:

- Take a long thread in color no. 157, enter at the back of the head, and come out on the outside of the first eye just above the round with the increases (photo 1). Put your thread under the eye and go 2 stitches further back into the head (photo 2 ), come out at the same place where you entered at the back of the head. Pull your thread so that the eye lies a little "deeper". Put a knot in your threads.

- Repeat for the second eye.
- Take a long white thread. Insert your needle through the back of the head and come out above the eye on the inside (1), go long the outside of the eye to about half and go 1 stitch further back into the head (2). Come out just above the round with the increases against the eye (3). Go back into the head in the same place as with no (2). Now fill with 2 stitches the "corner" that you have created. Eventually, come out at the same place at the back of the head as at your beginning. Put a knot in the ends and work the threads away invisibly. Do the same with the $2^{\text {nd }}$ eye.



## Snout 2x:

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Using color no. 263.
Rnd 01: MR with 6sc
Rnd 02: 2sc in each stitch
Rnd 03: *1sc, 2 sc in $1^{*} \times 6$
2slst and fasten off with a long thread.

- Sew the muzzle parts between round 16 to round 20. Let them touch each other in the middle. Then embroider with double black thread a triangular nose and a line down to just on the last round of the muzzle parts.
- Embroider the eyebrows with black above the eyes.

- Sew the head tightly to the neck. If necessary, insert a piece of electrical wire or a skewer through the head and neck to the body for firmness. Don't forget to stuff the neck properly!


## Ears 2x:

Using color no. 157.
Rnd 01: MR with 6sc
Rnd 02: 1sc in each stitch
Rnd 03: *2sc, 2 sc in 1* x 2
Rnd 04: *3sc, 2sc in 1* x 2
Rnd 05: *4sc, 2 sc in $1^{*} \times 2$
Rnd 06: *5sc, 2sc in 1* x 2
Rnd 07 - 08: 1sc in each stitch
Rnd 09: *6sc, 2sc in 1* x 2
Rnd 10: *7sc, 2sc in 1* x 2

Rnd 11: *8sc, 2 sc in $1^{*} \times 2$
Rnd 12-21: 1sc in each stitch
Rnd 22: *3sc, sc2tog* $x 4$
Rnd 23: 1sc in each stitch
Rnd 24: 1slst, skip 6 stitches, 1slst, the rest of the stitches remains unworked.
Fasten off with a long thread to sew the ears with later.
Pin the ears from round 3 to round 6. The back of the ears aligns with the center of the magic ring.


## Dress:

Using color no. 385.
We're going to start with double crochet chainless foundation. For those who do not know how to do this, you can view this link.

Row 01: set up 28 Dc, Ch1, turn
Row 02: 1sc, *2sc in 1* x 26, 1sc, Ch1, turn
Row 03: 1sc in each stitch, change to color no. 100 on the last stitch, Ch1, turn
Fasten off color no. 385.
Row 04: *1sc, 1SSC* x 26, 2sc, Ch1, turn
Row 05-07: 1sc in each stitch, change to color no. 385 on the last stitch of row 7, Ch1, turn
Fasten off color no. 100.
Row 08: 2sc, *1SSC, 1sc* x 26, Ch1, turn

Row 09-10: 1sc in each stitch, Ch1, turn
Row 11: front loops only, 1sc in each stitch, Ch1, turn
Row 12-15: 1sc in each stitch, change to color no. 100 on the last stitch of row 15, Ch1, turn
Fasten off color no. 385.
Row 16: *1sc, 1SSC* x 26, 2sc, Ch1, turn
Row 17: 1sc in each stitch, change to color no. 385 on the last stitch, Ch1, turn
Fasten off color no. 100.
Row 18: back loops only, 1sc in each stitch, Ch1, turn
Row 19: 1sc in each stitch, turn
Row 20: *Ch1, 1slst* x 54

## Fasten off.

- With the attachment row facing you, pick up color no. 100 in the $1^{\text {st }}$ remaining loop of row 11, Ch1, 1slst in the same loop, *1 $\mathrm{Hdc}, 1 \mathrm{Dc}, 3 \mathrm{Tc}$ in $1,1 \mathrm{Dc}, 1 \mathrm{Hdc}, 1 \mathrm{slst} * 8,1 \mathrm{Hdc}, 1 \mathrm{Dc}, 3 \mathrm{Tc}$ in 1, 1Dc, $1 \mathrm{Hdc}+1$ slst in the same loop


## Fasten off.

- With the attachment row facing you, pick up color no. 100 in the $1^{\text {st }}$ remaining loop of row 18, Ch1, 1slst in the same loop, *Ch1, 1hv* $x 53$



## Fasten off.

## Top part:

Using color no. 385.
With the right side of your work towards you.
Row 01: attach with 1 sc in the $1^{\text {st }}$ of the attachment row, 27 sc , Ch1, turn

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Row 02: 1 RSC in each stitch, Ch1, turn
Row 03: 1sc in each stitch, Ch1, turn
Row 04: 1 RSC in each stitch, Ch1, turn
Row 05: 1sc in each stitch, Ch1, turn
Row 06: 1 RSC in each stitch, Ch1, turn
Row 07: *1slst, Ch1* x 3, 1slst, 10Ch, skip 6 stitches on the dress, *1slst, Ch1* x 7, 1slst, 10Ch, skip 6 stitches on the dress, *1slst, Ch1* x 3, 1slst

Fasten off with a long thread to sew the back of the dress closed.
Hide all loose ends except for the long thread ()
Put on the dress. Sew the back closed with the mattress stitch.
