<u>Arm 2x:</u>

Using skin tone

Rnd 01: MR with 6sc

Rnd 02 – 21: 1 sc in each stitch

1slst and fasten off.

Put a small piece of tape around 1 end of the pipe cleaner and insert it all the way down the arm. Leave about 1 cm above the arm. Put a piece of tape around the end here too.



Dress:

Using **white**.

From now on we will work in rows and also with reverse sc; For those who don't know how to crochet this one. Wolplein has a clear video for it.

Row 01: Leave a long thread to start. 20 Ch, start in 2^e stitch from the hook, 2sc, (1sc+2Ch+1sc) in 1 stitch, 3sc, (1sc+2Ch+1sc) in 1 stitch, 5sc, (1sc+2Ch+1sc) in 1 stitch, 2sc, Ch1, turn (23sc+8Ch)

Row 02: 3 Rsc, (1 Rsc+2Ch+1 Rsc) in chain space, 5 Rsc, (1 Rsc+2Ch+1 Rsc) in chain space, 7 Rsc, (1 Rsc+2Ch+1 Rsc) in chain space, 5 Rsc, (1 Rsc+2Ch+1 Rsc) in chain space, 3 Rsc, Ch1, turn **(31 RSC+8Ch)**

Row 03: 4sc, (1sc+2Ch+1sc) in chain space, 7sc, (1sc+2Ch+1sc) in chain space, 9sc, (1sc+2Ch+1sc) in chainspace, 7sc, (1sc+2Ch+1sc) in chain space, 4sc, Ch1, turn(39sc+8Ch)

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(6) (6) **Row 04:** 5 Rsc, 1 Rsc in chain space, Ch4, skip the single crochets, 1 Rsc in next chain space, 11 Rsc, 1 Rsc in chain space, Ch4, skip the single crochets, 1 Rsc, 1 Rsc in next chain space 5 Rsc, Ch1, turn

Using colornr 410.

Rnd 01: attach with 1slst in the bottom corner of the arm, *3 Ch, 1slst* x 12



Fasten off. Do the same for the other sleeve.

<u>Collar:</u>

Using colornr 410.

Rnd 01: attach with 1slst in 1^e stitch at the back, *3 Ch, 1slst* x 20

Fasten off. Hide all loose ends, except the long starting thread.

Rnd 24: 13sc, **1** sc in the back loop of the next stitch, 14sc, **1** sc in the back loop of the next stitch (this stitch is past your mark). Move your marker to this last stitch as end of the round. This does NOT change the amount of stitches. (28)

Rnd 25 - 28: 12sc, 1 sc in the back loop of the next stitch, 14sc, 1 sc in the back loop of the next stitch (28)

Rnd 29: 13sc, **1** sc in the back loop of the next stitch, 14sc, **1** sc in the back loop of the next stitch (this stitch is past your mark). Move your marker to this last stitch as end of the round. This does NOT change the amount of stitches. (28)

Rnd 30 - 33: 12sc, 1 sc in the back loop of the next stitch, 14sc, 1 sc in the back loop of the next stitch (28)

Rnd 34: 13sc, **1** sc in the back loop of the next stitch, 14sc, **1** sc in the back loop of the next stitch (this stitch is past your mark). Move your marker to this last stitch as end of the round. This does NOT change the amount of stitches. (28)

Rnd 35 - 38: 12sc, 1 sc in the back loop of the next stitch, 14sc, 1 sc in the back loop of the next stitch (28)

Rnd 39: 13sc, **1** sc in the back loop of the next stitch, 14sc, **1** sc in the back loop of the next stitch (this stitch is past your mark). Move your marker to this last stitch as end of the round. This does NOT change the amount of stitches. (28)

Rnd 40 - 43: 12sc, 1 sc in the back loop of the next stitch, 14sc, 1 sc in the back loop of the next stitch (28)

Rnd 45 - 47: 1 sc in each stitch

1sc, Move your marker to this last stitch as end of the round. Pull the loop large or put a darning thread through the loop. Let the skin tone rest for a while.

We are going to crochet the edge of the shell first.

<u>Edge:</u>

Using **white.**

For convenience we start with row 1. After crocheting the edge we continue the round that we have interrupted.

Rnd 01: with the tip away from you, attach with 1sc in the 1^e remaining loop of rnd 15 (see photo), 12sc, sc3 in 1, we crochet now in the remaining loops on the side, 28sc, you are now on the remaining loops of rnd 44, sc3 in 1, 12sc, sc3 in 1, we crochet now in the remaining loops on the side towards the beginning, 28sc, 2sc in the same loop as your start sc, close round with 1slst in the 1^e stitch (92)



Rnd 02: 2 Ch, back loops only, 3Hdc in each stitch, close round with 1slst in the 1^e Hdc (276)

Rnd 03: 2 Ch, 1Hdc in each stitch, close round with 1slst in the 1^e Hdc

Fasten off white. Hide loose end.



We continue to work on the body and in rows. We start crocheting the bend to crochet upwards.We also use reverse single crochet.Row 01: 12sc, Ch 1, turnRow 02: 12 RSC, Ch 1, turn(12)

Row 03: 12sc, Ch 1, turn	(12)
Row 04: 12 RSC, Ch 1, turn	(12)
Row 05: 12sc, Ch 1, turn	(12)
Row 06: 12 RSC, Ch 1, turn	(12)

We crochet back into rounds from here.

Rnd 48: 12sc, 6sc in row-ends, 2sc on the body, 12sc in back loops only, 2sc, (you are now on the mark. Remove the marker, we crochet a bit further), 6sc in row-ends, mark this last stitch as end of rnd.(40)

Rnd 49: 12sc, sc2tog, 24sc, sc2tog

Rnd 50: 11sc, sc2tog, 24sc, sc2tog (past the mark), move the marker to this stitch as end of the rnd(36)

Rnd 51: 10sc, sc2tog, 6sc, insert your hook through the first remaining loop from round 48 AND into the next stitch on the body (see photo), make 1sc, * insert your hook through the next remaining loop from round 48 AND into the next stitch on the body, make 1sc * x 11, 5sc, sc2tog (past the mark), move the marker to this stitch as end of the rnd (34)



Rnd 52: 8sc, sc2tog, 23sc, sc2tog (past the mark), move the marker to this stitch as end of the rnd(32)

Rnd 53: 1 sc in each stitch	(32)
Rnd 54: *6sc, sc2tog* x 4	(28)

Take a piece of electrical wire of about 50 cm. (Depending on the yarn you use, the length of the thread may vary, so measure at the bottom of your work, starting from the tip to the front, and take this length 2x (photo 1)) Fold the thread in half and push the side where you bend well against each other (photo 2). Twist the wires almost to the top (Photo 3).

Now put the point in the pointed tail (place your workpiece on a flat surface), fold your wire slightly upwards at the front (photo 4). Stuff firmly to just past the white edge. Later you can stuff further for the curve and the straight upwards.

Take a piece of thread in skin tone. Now fold your iron wire straight up. You now get a flap on the "back" that lies flat. (see photo). Sew this with a few stitches so that your body stays nice and straight.

Stuff firmly.

We now crochet the arms to the body. I chose to have her look sideways so that you can also see the shell. You can also let her look forward, but then you have to calculate yourself where the arms will be. ©

Rnd 69: 5sc, put your hook through the next stitch after the slst on the arm AND through the next stitch on the body, make 1sc, *put your hook through the next stitch on the arm AND through the next stitch on the body, make 1sc* x 2, 8sc, put your hook through the next stitch after the slip stitch on the arm AND through the next stitch on the body, make 1sc, *put your hook through the next stitch on the arm AND through the next stitch on the body, make 1sc, *put your hook through the next stitch on the arm AND through the next stitch on the body, make 1sc, *put your hook through the next stitch on the arm **AND** through the next stitch on the body, make 1sc* x 2, 3sc **(22)**

Push the pieces of pipe cleaners from the arms into the body. Stuff firmly around the pipe cleaners and the iron wire. Continue to stuff while crocheting.

Gelaatsuitdrukking maken:

*Take a long thread in skin color. Enter the head in the back, and come out on the outside of the first eye (photo 1). Turn the thread clockwise, and enter in the head on the same place you came out (photo 2). Pull thread so the eye will "indent". * Do the same on the inside of the eye.

Repeat ** for the other eye. Make a knot in the ends and hide loose ends.

Embroider the nose 1 round beneath the eyes.

Embroider the mouth 2 rounds below the nose.

Add some blush on the cheeks and glue the eye lashes on her eyes.

<u>Feeler 2x:</u> Make a curl in the pipe cleaner, insert the left one on row 4 counting from the top of the head, and the right one on row 5 (insert into a hole and not through the thread). The feelers stick out 4_cm above my head and they protrude about 3 cm in the head.

Fold the edge in half and close with 4sc.	

Fasten off leaving a longer piece of thread.

* Sew the ears in a straight line with the top of the ear 4 rounds lower than the feeler.

<u>Haír:</u>

Color of choice. Pieces of 10 cm.

Remove the feelers and insert a piece of skewer so that you can find the holes where the feelers should go afterwards.

Start in the 4th row above the eyes. Work in an oblique line down to 4 rows below the ear. Knot the hair, use every stitch on every row up to the crown. At the back of the head you can safely skip 1 row in between.



Cut the threads at a height of approx. 3 cm. Then comb them with a dog comb until fluffy. Once the whole haircut is done, trim the hair a little more until you see the tips of her ears.

<u>TIP:</u> Cut and comb the hair after every 2 rows of knots. This is slightly easier than combing everything in one go afterwards.



Hair knotting method:

Insert your crochet hook into the head, (photo 1), take your thread double and pull it through (photo 2), wrap the thread and pull it through the loop (photo 3).



<u>Cottage:</u>

Using **white.**

Note: some rounds do not take into account the marking of the tour. Just follow the pattern is the message. ⁽²⁾ We also do not fasten off the colors, but leave the thread hanging on the inside of the house so that you can easily pick up the thread again at the color change.

We are going to start with double crochet instead of chainstitches. For those who do not know how to do this, can view this link. Wendy Rademaker explains it very well.

Rnd 01: Crochet 84 double crochet. The chst do NOTcount as first stitch. Close round with 1slst in 1^e Dc

To obtain a nice distribution of the stuffing, it is best to stuff in moderately after a few stitches at a time. Use the back of a regular crochet hook or the tip of a pair of scissors to tuck your stuffing in between the fold. (72)

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Fasten off leaving a longer piece of thread. Wave thread through the front loops and pull, so the gap will close. Hide loose end.



Sew the shell in the remaining loops of the body where you worked the white border. 1 stitch per remaining loop!



- * Thread the satin ribbon through the holes at the color change on the dress.
- * Make a bow in the front with the ribbon.
- * Apply some decoration.
