Optional: some feathers and pearls to finish.

## Pattern.

Arm 2x: these are described separately for the left arm and the right arm. Using skin color.

Make 5 fingers for one hand (4 fingers and 1 thumb). Just before starting the hand, make the index finger

## Fingers:

## Pinky and thumb $2 x$

Rnd 01: MR with 5sc
Rnd 02 - 04: 1sc in each stitch, 1slst, Fasten off

## Middle finger $2 x$

Rnd 01: MR with 5sc
Rnd 02 - 06: 1sc in each stitch, 1slst, Fasten off

## Ring- and index finger $2 x$

Rnd 01: MR with 5sc
Rnd 02 - 05: 1sc in each stitch, 1slst, Fasten off
DO NOT fasten off your index finger and the slst is not necessary either.


## Left hand / arm:

Rnd 01: 3sc on the index finger, start each finger on the slip stitch, 3sc on the middle finger, 3sc on the ring finger, $5 s c$ on the pinky, $2 s c$ on the ring finger, $2 s c$ on the middle finger, $2 s c$ on the index finger

Rnd 02 - 03: 1sc in each stitch
Rnd 04: 2sc, *1sc through thumb and hand* $\mathrm{x} 2,16 \mathrm{sc}$
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Rnd 05: 2sc, 3sc on the thumb, 16sc
Rnd 06: 1sc, sc2tog, 5sc, sc2tog, 3sc, sc2tog, 6sc
Rnd 07: *4sc, sc2tog* x 3
Rnd 08: *3sc, sc2tog* x 3
We make bendable fingers. Take the pipe cleaner double and twist it together. Push the loop into the finger and let the rest stick out of the hand. Do this with the 4 fingers and the thumb. Carefully stuff the hand. Now twist the "stems" that stick out of the hand nicely together. Put some tape around the end. You can now also fold the arm as soon as it is finished.


Rnd 09: 1sc in each stitch
Rnd 10: *3sc, sc2 in 1* x 3
Stuff the arm moderately and continue to stuff moderately as you crochet the arm.
Rnd 11-28: 1sc in each stitch
7sc + 1slst. Fasten off. Count forward 6 stitches and make a mark on this stitch.


## Right hand/arm:

Rnd 01: 2 sc on the index finger, start each finger on the slip stitch, 2 sc on the middle finger, 2 sc on the ring finger, $5 s c$ on the pinky, $3 s c$ on the ring finger, $3 s c$ on the middle finger, $3 s c$ on the index finger

Rnd 02-03: 1sc in each stitch
Rnd 04: 17sc, *1sc through thumb and hand* $\times 2$, 1sc
Rnd 05: 17sc, 3sc on the thumb, 1sc
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Rnd 06: 4sc, sc2tog, 3sc, sc2tog, 5sc, sc2tog, 3sc
Rnd 07: *4sc, sc2tog* 3
Rnd 08: *3sc, sc2tog* 3
Do the same as with the left arm to make the arms pliable.
Rnd 09: 1sc in each stitch
Rnd 10: *3sc, sc2 in 1* x 3
Rnd 11-28: 1sc in each stitch

## 1slst. Fasten off.

## Stuff the arm moderately. Count forward 3 stitches and make a mark on this stitch.



## Shoe 2x:

Using colornr 502.
The 3 chainstitches count as 1 dc
Rnd 01: Ch 11, start in $4^{\text {th }}$ stitch from the hook, $7 \mathrm{dc}, 5 \mathrm{dc}$ in 1, continue on the other side of the chain, $7 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in 1 (use the bottom chain of the starting chains here), Close round with 1 slst in $3^{\text {th }} \mathrm{ch}$ (24)

Rnd 02: Ch $3,7 \mathrm{dc},{ }^{* d c} 2$ in $1^{*} \times 5,7 \mathrm{dc},{ }^{*} \mathrm{dc} 2$ in $1^{*} \times 4,1 \mathrm{dc}$ in the closing stitch, Close round with 1 slst in $3^{\text {th }}$ ch

Rnd 03: Ch 1, start on the first dc with your $1^{e}$ stitch, 7 sc , hdc2 in $1,1 \mathrm{hst}, 7 \mathrm{x}$ (dc2 in 1 ), 1 hdc , hdc2 in $1,16 \mathrm{sc}$, close round with 1 slst in first sc

Rnd 04: Ch 1, start in closing stitch, 1sc in each stitch, change to colornr 201, close round with 1slst in first sc. Fasten off colornr 502.

Rnd 05: start in back loop of closing stitch, back loops only, 39sc, (mark this 39 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ steek), 5 sc , close round with 1slst in first sc Fasten off.

Rnd 06: Pick up your thread in colornr 386 in the marked stitch, $1 \mathrm{Ch}, 1$ CRSTDC** (the first dc of your cross stitch is placed on the $40^{\text {th }}$ stitch, and the second dc will then be placed on your marked stitch), 1CRSTDC in each stitch, at the last stitch switch to colornr 201, close round with 1 slst in $1^{\text {st }}$ stitch(44)

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Rnd 07: Ch 1, start in closing stitch, 1sc in each stitch, at the last stitch switch to colornr 502, close round with 1slst in $1^{\text {st }}$ stitch

## Fasten off colornr 201.

Rnd 08 - 09: Ch 1, start in closing stitch, 1sc in each stitch, close round with 1slst in $1^{\text {st }}$ stitch
Rnd 10: Ch 1 , start in closing stitch, $13 \mathrm{sc}, 1 \mathrm{hdc}, 1 \mathrm{dc}$, *skip 1 stitch, $1 \mathrm{dc}^{*} \times 9,1 \mathrm{hdc}, 10 \mathrm{sc}$, close round with 1 slst in $1^{\text {st }}$ stitch

Rnd 11: Ch 1, start in closing stitch, 1sc in each stitch, close round with 1slst in $1^{\text {st }}$ stitch
Rnd 12: Ch 1 , start in closing stitch, $11 \mathrm{sc}, 1 \mathrm{hdc}, 1 \mathrm{dc}$, *skip 1 stitch, $1 \mathrm{dc}{ }^{*} \times 7,1 \mathrm{hdc}, 7 \mathrm{sc}$, close round with 1 slst in $1^{\text {st }}$ stitch

Rnd 13: Ch 1, start in closing stitch, 3sc, mark this $3^{\text {th }}$ steek, 1sc in each stitch, close round with 1slst in $1^{\text {st }}$ stitch

## Fasten off and hide all loose ends.

## Continue in rows.

Row 01: Attach with 1 sc in the marked stitch, $1 \mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{sc} 2$ in $1,8 \mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{sc} 2$ in $1,4 \mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{sc} 2$ in $1,8 \mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{sc} 2$ in 1 , 2sc, Ch1, turn

Row 02: 1sc in each stitch, Ch1, turn
Row 03: 1sc, Ch 1, skip 1 stitch, 28sc, Ch 1, skip 1 stitch, 1sc, Ch1, turn
Row 04: 1sc in each stitch and in each chain space, Ch1, turn
Row 05: 1sc in each stitch, Ch1, turn
Row 06: 1sc, Ch 1, skip 1 stitch, 28sc, Ch 1, skip 1 stitch, 1sc, Ch1, turn
Row 07: 1sc in each stitch and in each chain space, Ch1, turn
Row 08: 1sc in each stitch, Ch1, turn
Row 09: 1sc, Ch 1, skip 1 stitch, 28sc, Ch 1, skip 1 stitch, 1 sc , Ch1, turn
Row 10: 1sc in each stitch, Ch1, turn
Row 11: back loops only, 1 slst in each stitch

## Fasten off, hide all loose ends.

- Make in colornr 502 another sole from round 01 to 04 . Place the sole on a piece of cardboard and trace the outline around. Now cut out your shape on the inside of the line. Trim if necessary to make the cardboard fit nicely.

- Now place the sole right side down against the sole of your shoe. With the sole towards you, *take the next stitch on your sole AND the opposite remaining loop of the shoe (see photo), and work 1 slst*, repeat ** to end of round. Close with slst in $1^{\text {st }}$ stitch and fasten off. Don't forget to put your cardboard in between before you have crocheted all the way around.
- Cut 32 strands of 6 cm approx from colornr 502. Knot them in the remaining loops from row 11. If you find them too long after tying them, you can trim them a little more.
- Crochet a chain of 80 chains for each shoe as a shoelace. Tighten the chains firmly.



## Pouch Gag:

Start with colornr 502.
Row 01: Ch 15 , start in $2^{\text {nd }}$ chain from the hook, 14 sc, Ch1, turn
Row 02-17: 14sc, Ch1, turn
Row 18: front loops only, 14sc, Ch1, turn
Row 19 - 32: 14sc, Ch1, turn
Row 33: 14sc
Fold your work double on the remaining loops from row 18. We work a round with single crochets around as follows;

Insert your hook into the same st as the last sc of row 33 AND through the row end opposite, make 1 sc , *insert your hook through the 2 layers together in the next row end, make $1 \mathrm{sc}{ }^{*} \times 14,3 \mathrm{sc}$ in 1 in the $1^{\text {st }}$ remaining loop, 12 sc in the remaining loops, 3 sc in 1 in the last remaining loop, ${ }^{*}$ insert your hook through the 2 layers together in the next row end, make 1 sc * x 15 .

Now continue working on the top row of the back piece.

Row 01: 14sc, Ch1, turn
Row 02: 14sc, Ch1, turn
Row 03: *1sc, Ch 2, skip 2 stitches* x 2, 2sc, *Ch 2, skip 2 stitches, 1sc* $\times 2$, Ch1, turn
Row 04: * 1 sc , 2 sc in chain space ${ }^{*} \times 2,2 \mathrm{sc},{ }^{*} 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in chain space, $1 \mathrm{sc}{ }^{*} \times 2$, Ch1, turn
Row 05: 1 slst in each stitch

## Fasten off and hide all loose ends.

## Apply some fringe in the front loops.



## Foot/Leg:

Using skin color and in closing rounds.
The 3 chainstitches count as 1 dc
Rnd 01: Ch 11, start in $4^{\text {th }}$ stitch from the hook, $7 \mathrm{dc}, 5 \mathrm{dc}$ in 1 , continue on the other side of the chain, $7 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in 1 (use the bottom chain of the starting chains here), Close round with 1 slst in $3^{\text {th }} \mathrm{ch}$ (24)

Rnd 02: Ch 3, 7dc, *dc2 in $1^{*} \times 5,7 \mathrm{dc},{ }^{*} \mathrm{dc} 2$ in $1^{*} \times 4,1 \mathrm{dc}$ in closing stitch, Close round with 1 slst in $3^{\text {th }}$ ch

Rnd 03: Ch $1,7 \mathrm{sc}$, hdc2 in $1,1 \mathrm{hst},{ }^{*} \mathrm{dc} 2$ in $1^{*} \mathrm{x} 7,1 \mathrm{hdc}, \mathrm{hdc} 2$ in $1,15 \mathrm{sc}$, close round with 1 slst in first SC

Continue in continuous rounds.
Rnd 04: Ch 1, 1sc in each back loop, (start in closing stitch and end in closing stitch)
Rnd 05-07: 1sc in each stitch
Rnd 08: 9sc, *sc2tog*, 18sc
Rnd 09: 8sc, *sc2tog* x 5, 17sc
Rnd 10: 6sc, *sc2tog* x 5, 14sc
Rnd 11: 5sc, *sc2tog* x 3, 14sc
Stuff the foot firmly. Make sure that the bottom does not become too convex.

Rnd 12-22: 1sc in each stitch
Rnd 23: 3sc, sc2 in 1, 12sc, sc2 in 1, 5sc
Rnd 24-25: 1sc in each stitch
Put the shoe on and stuff the foot firmly. The foot must be tight in the shoe!


Rnd 26-39: 1sc in each stitch
Stuff the leg and continue to stuff it as you crochet.
2sc +1slst with change to colornr 502. Mark this last stitch as end of the round.
Rnd 40-43: 1sc in each stitch
1slst (this one is to smooth out the round), Fasten off.
Make second leg up to round 43, but DO NOT fasten off and slst does not have to be done here at the end. Continue with row 1 of the body on this leg.

## Body:

Take the first leg and count 7 sts back (i.e. 1slst and 6sc back) place a marker there.
Rnd 01: we crochet furthter, 7sc (these are not included in the grand total), Ch 3, take the first leg and continue in the marked stitch, 1 sc (the legs are now connected), 23sc on this leg, 1sc in each chain (3) 24 sc on the next leg, 1 sc in each chain (also 3), mark the last stitch as end of the round(54)


Rnd 02-12: 1sc in each stitch
Rnd 13: *7sc, sc2tog* x 6

1sc with change to skin color, mark the last sc as end of the round. This will NOT change your amount of stitches.

Rnd 14: 1sc in each stitch
Continue stuffing.


Rnd 15: 11sc, 2 x *sc2tog*, 19sc, 2 x *sc2tog*, 10sc
Rnd 16: 11sc, sc2tog, 19sc, sc2tog, 10sc
Rnd 17-30: 1sc in each stitch

## Stuff the body firmly.

We are now going to attach the arms.
Take the left arm. This is crocheted to the body first.
If the arm does not fit nicely against the body, take 1 or 2 stitches further to join the arm.
Rnd 31: 10sc, insert your crochet hook through the marked stitch of the arm AND into the next stitch of the body (see photo), make 1 sc , repeat in the next 6 stitches, 14 sc , insert your crochet hook through the marked stitch of the arm AND into the next stitch of the body, make 1sc, repeat in the next 6 stitches, 4sc


## Attached arms

Rnd 32: 10sc, 8 sc on the unworked stitches of the arm, 14 sc on the body, 8 sc on the unworked stitches of the arm, 4sc

Rnd 33: 2sc, sc2tog, 20sc, sc2tog, 18sc
Rnd 34: 1sc in each stitch
Rnd 35: *5sc, sc2tog* 6
Rnd 36: 1sc in each stitch
Rnd 37: *4sc, sc2tog* x 6
Rnd 38: *3sc, sc2tog* 6
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Stuff firmly, especially at the shoulders and neck.
Rnd 39: *2sc, sc2tog* $\times 6$
Rnd 40-42: 1sc in each stitch
Fasten off, leaving long thread for sewing.


Stuff the neck firmly. I placed an iron wire to strengthen the neck. Take a piece of iron wire of about 20 cm and fold it in half. Twist the wire together and put a piece of tape around the end to avoid sharp edges.

Insert your thread into the head for reinforcement and the other end into the body.

Rnd 01: MR with 6sc, do not close the magic ring too tightly so that you can insert an electrical wire or other reinforcement afterwards.

Rnd 03: *1sc, sc2 in $1^{*} \times 6$
Rnd 04: back loops only, 1sc in each stitch
Rnd 05: *2sc, sc2 in 1* x 6
Rnd 06: *3sc, sc2 in $1 * \times 6$
Rnd 07: *4sc, sc2 in $1^{*} \times 6$
Rnd 08: *5sc, sc2 in $1^{*} x 6$
Rnd 09: *6sc, sc2 in $1^{*} x 6$
Rnd 10: *7sc, sc2 in $1^{*} \times 6$
Rnd 11: *8sc, sc2 in $1 * \times 6$
Rnd 12: *9sc, sc2 in $1^{*} \times 6$

Rnd 13 - 18: 1sc in each stitch
Rnd 19: 24sc, Ch 1, skip 1 stitch, 7sc, Ch 1, skip 1 stitch, 33sc
Rnd 20: 1sc in each stitch and in each chain space
Rnd 21-23: 1sc in each stitch
Rnd 24: *9sc, sc2tog* x 6
Rnd 25: *8sc, sc2tog* x 6
Rnd 26: *7sc, sc2tog* x 6
Rnd 27: *6sc, sc2tog* x 6
Stuff the head firmly and place your eyes in the chain spaces of round 19. Put the safety caps on the eyes.


Rnd 28: *5sc, sc2tog* x 6
Rnd 29: *4sc, sc2tog* x 6
Rnd 30: *3sc, sc2tog* x 6
Rnd 31: *2sc, sc2tog* x 6
Rnd 32: *1sc, sc2tog* $x 6$
Rnd 33: *sc2tog* $\times 6$
Fasten off, weave your yarn through the front loops of the remaining stitches and pull the hole closed. Hide all loose ends invisibly.

## Facial expression:

Take a long skin color thread, enter the bottom of the head (Photo 1), and come out on the outside of the first eye (Photo 2). Wrap your thread, clockwise, around the eye and go back into the head where you came out (Photo 3). Tighten your thread, so that the eye goes a little "deeper". Now do the same on the inside of the eye. Tie a knot in your threads.

Repeat for the second eye.

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Hide all loose ends.
Embroider the nose 1 round lower than the bottom of the eyes.
Place the mouth 2 rounds lower than the nose. Put some blush on the cheeks and stick some lashes on top of the eyes.


Hair:
Using black.
Cut 99 threads of 60 cm and fasten them in the same way as in the video.
https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=bJQrWitqm30
It's simple and much faster than tying threads $\vartheta ।$ used 3 threads per row. And in total I sewed the hair over 33 rounds. Starting between $4^{\text {th }}$ and $5^{\text {th }}$ round above eyes. Then make a braid on each side of the head.

Row 01: start with 4 Ch, Double Crochet Chainless Foundation 29dc

Row 02: 1sc in each stitch, change to colornr 386 in the last sc, Ch1, turn. Fasten off colornr 201.(30)
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Row 03: Ch 3 (counts as $1^{\text {st }}$ dc), $14 \times 1$ CRSTDC, 1dc with change to colornr 201, Ch1, turn. Fasten off colornr 386.

Row 04: 1sc in each stitch, change to colornr 502 in the last sc, Ch1, turn. Fasten off colornr 201.(30)
Row 05-15: 1sc in each stitch, Ch1, turn
Row 16: 15 sc , mark this $15^{\text {th }}$ stitch, 15 sc , turn!!!!!

Row 20: sc2tog, 4sc, Ch1, turn
Row 21: 5sc, Ch1, turn
Row 22: sc2tog, 3sc, Ch1, turn
Row 23: 4sc, Ch1, turn
Row 24: sc2tog, 2sc, Ch1, turn
Row 25: 3sc, Ch1, turn
Row 26: 3sc
Fasten off leaving long thread for sewing the 3 stitches from the shoulder together.

## Part 3:

Row 13: skip 8 stitches and attach with 1sc in the $\mathbf{9}^{\text {th }}$ stitch after part 2, 10sc, Ch1, turn


Row 14: 1sc, ch 1, skip 1 stitch, 8sc, Ch1, turn
Row 15: 1sc in each stitch and in each chain space, Ch1, turn
Row 16-17: 10sc, Ch1, turn
Row 18: 1sc, ch 1, skip 1 stitch, 8 sc , Ch1, turn
Row 19: 1sc in each stitch and in each chain space, Ch1, turn
Row 20-21: 10sc, Ch1, turn
Row 22: 1sc, ch 1, skip 1 stitch, 8sc, Ch1, turn
Row 23: sc2tog, 3sc, sc2tog, Ch1, turn
Row 24: sc2tog, 1sc, sc2tog, Ch1, turn
Row 25: 3sc, Ch1, turn


Row 26: 3sc
Fasten off leaving long thread for sewing the 3 stitches from the shoulder together.
Turn your work inside out and sew the shoulder stitches together.
Hide all loose ends.

- Take 1 thread of colornr 386 and 1 of colornr 201. Twist these together as a belt for around the dress. Thread the strap through the holes in the pouch first. (see finished photo)
- Also take a thread of each color approx. $\mathbf{7 5} \mathrm{cm}$ and sew with the 2 threads around the neck of the dress.
- Make a chain of 150 chain stitches in colornr 502 and thread it through the chain spaces on the back.
- Make some fringe on the armholes.
- Make a braid with 3 strands Blue and 3 strands Orange together. Use this as a headband $\vartheta$ finish with some pearls and feathers.
- Sew the head to the neck with the remaining loops on the head and the stitches on the neck. Make sure you position the head nicely before sewing it on $)$



## Quiver:

Using dark brown.
Rnd 01: MR with 6sc
Rnd 02: Sc2 in each stitch
Rnd 03: * 1 sc , sc2 in $1^{*}$ x 6
Rnd 04: *2v, sc2 in $1^{*} \times 6$
Rnd 05: back loops only, 1sc in each stitch
Cut a bottom of cardboard the size of the circle to place in the tube afterwards.
Rnd 06-18: 1sc in each stitch
1slst + 1slst with change to colornr 502. DO NOT fasten off dark brown. Bring this thread to the outside of your work and let it rest until later.

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$\qquad$

Rnd 19: back loops only, 1sc in each stitch
Place your cardboard in the bottom.
Rnd 20: *6sc, sc2tog* x 3
Rnd 21 - 31: 1sc in each stitch
Rnd 32: *5sc, sc2tog* x 3
Rnd 33: *1sc, sc2tog* x 6
Rnd 34: *sc2tog* x 6
Fasten off with a slightly longer thread, pull the thread through the front loops and close the hole. Hide your thread invisibly.


## Gently push the light brown in.

- Pick up dark thread in $1^{\text {st }}$ remaining loop from Round 19 (Photo 1), ch1, slst in same loop, ch45, sl st in $1^{\text {st }}$ remaining loop at bottom round 5 (Photo 2 ), slst in each remaining loop $(=24)$, slst on each chain stitch, slst on next remaining loop from round 19

- Fasten off. Hide all loose ends.
- Arrows can be made with toothpicks. Put some glue on 1 side and stick some feathers on it.

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- You can make the bow with a pipe cleaner. Make a loop at each corner of 1 cm . Take a light brown wire the length of the pipe cleaner. Make a slip knot on either side that you hang in the loop of the pipe cleaner. (put 1 side in loop first) Now wrap dark brown thread tightly around the pipe cleaner. Once you've reached the end, slide the 2 nd slipknot into the loop. Continue yarn to the end. Glue the end with good UHU glue.
