Skill level: Easy

Materials:

Yarn in the colours you prefer: I used as main colour: light brown, sub colour: pink

I hope this can help you cos in Europe we have other yarn than in America.



Hook 4.5 mm

Yarn needle

Stuffing (fiberfill)

Scissors

Abbreviations:

Ch – chain stitch

dec – decrease

- FO fasten off
- Inc increase
- MR magic ring
- Sc single crochet
- rep repeat
- rnd(s) round(s)

** x... - repeat instructions between asterisk ... times

(...) at the end of the round is the amount of stitches after completing this round

Pattern:

Head: using light brown (or colour of your choice)

Working in continuous rounds

Rnd 01: Magic ring, 6sc	(6)
Rnd 02: inc x 6 times	(12)
Rnd 03: *1sc, inc* x 6	(18)
Rnd 04: *2sc, inc* x 6	(24)
Rnd 05: *3sc, inc* x 6	(30)
Rnd 06: *4sc, inc* x 6	(36)
Rnd 07 to 13: sc around	(36)
Rnd 14: *4sc, dec* x 6	(30)
Rnd 15: *3sc, dec* x 6	(24)
Rnd 16: *2sc, dec* x 6	(18)

FO, stuff firmly, weave thread true the front loops, pull thread for closing the gap. Weave in loose end.

FO, stuff firmly, weave thread true the front loops, pull thread for closing the gap. Leave tail for sewing.

Arms 2x: starting with pink (or colour of your choice)

Rnd 01: Magic ring, 5sc		(5)
Rnd 02: inc x 5 times		(10)
Rnd 03: *1sc, inc* x 5 change colour to light brown		(15)
Rnd 04 to 13: sc around		(15)
Rnd 14: *1sc, dec* x 5	(10)	
FO, stuff the arms until round 12, leave long tail for sewing.		
Legs 2x: starting with pink (or colour of your choice)		
Working in continuous rounds		
Rnd 01: Magic ring, 5sc		(5)
Rnd 02: inc x 5 times		(10)
Rnd 03: *1sc, inc* x 5 change colour to light brown		(15)
Rnd 04: *2sc, inc* x 5	(20)	
Rnd 05 – 06: sc around		(20)
Rnd 07: dec x 5, 10sc		(15)
Rnd 08 to 11: sc around		(15)
Rnd 12: *1sc, dec* x 5	(10)	
FO, stuff firmly, leave long tail for sewing.		

Ears 2x: using light brown (or colour of your choice)

Rnd 03: *1sc, inc* x 5		(15)
Rnd 04: sc around		(15)
Rnd 05: *1sc, dec* x 5	(10)	
FO, don't stuff the ears, leave long tail for sewing.		

Muzzle: using pink

Rnd 01: Magic ring, 5sc	(5)
Rnd 02: inc x 5 times	(10)
Rnd 03: *1sc, inc* x 5	(15)
Rnd 04: sc around	(15)
FO, leave long tail for sewing.	
Tail: using pink	
Working in continuous rounds	
Rnd 01: Magic ring, 6sc	(6)
Rnd 02: inc x 6 times	(12)
Rnd 03: sc around	(12)
Rnd 04: dec x 6	(6)
FO, don't stuff the tail, leave long tail for sewing.	



Sew muzzle on to the head, between the 3rd row from the bottom

and the 7th row from the top. Stuff slightly.



Sew head to body, using the first row of each end.



This is how it should look after sewing together.



Sew the arm on to the body, using first row (Photo 1). Use each stitch from the arm.

Make sure you have positioned them correctly. Do this with both arms.

Photo 2 is how it should look like after attaching the arms.



Sew the legs on to the body between the 5th and the 6th row, counting from the bottom of the body. Use each stitch to attach them (Photo 1).

After attaching each stitch, bring up the needle underneath the arm (Photo 2).

Go into the arm and come out 2/3 stitches further (Photo 3).

Now go back into the body 2/3 stitches further then were you came out after sewing the leg (Photo 4).

Pull thread to attach the arm firmly against the body (Photo 5).

Repeat one more time. Starting from photo 2. After the second time, come out on the back of the bear.

Sew on the second leg the same way as the first. After the second time, come out at the same place as the thread of the first leg (on the back). Make a knot with both ends and weave in the loose ends.



Take a pink thread and bring it into the body and come out in the center of the foot (Photo 1).

Go back into the foot 1 stitch further (Photo 2) and come out in the first hole, created by the decreases of round 7, (Photo 3). Pull thread firmly.

Go back into the foot using the next hole (Photo 4) and come out in the center (Photo 1). Don't forget to pull the thread firmly after each process.

Repeat one more time with the next hole (Photo 5/6). Come out again in the center (Photo 1)



We are now going to attach the legs to each other so he can stand up ${}^{\textcircled{}}$.

Get into the foot and come out on the inner side of the foot (Photo 1). Get into the second leg and take 2/3 stitches (Photo 2) and come out in the same foot (Photo 3).

Pull the thread firmly and make sure the feet are lined up nicely (see Photo 6). If they are not aligned, remove the thread and take 1 or 2 stitches more or less to the back or to the front of the foot. Repeat one more time.

Come out in the center of the second foot (Photo 4) and repeat the same way as the first foot (Photo 4 & 5). The result should be like photo 6.



Sew the tail on the back of the bear. Starting at the same height as the leg attachment. Make sure you center the tail between the legs. Sew on with a few stitches (Photo 1).

Come out in the center of the tail with the last stitch (Photo 2). Make 3 more stitches on top of the tail (Photo 3). Weave in loose ends.



Sew the ears onto the head. Use Photo 1 & 2. Embroider the nose onto the muzzle Photo 3 & 4 & 5. Embroider the eyes using one stitch Photo 6 & 7.
